Special Issue on Applied Linguistics

“Applied Linguistics & Task-Based Grammar: Current Trends and Practices”

Prior to the *2nd Language Education and Research Conference* (LER conference; 3-4 October, 2020, Athens, Greece) the Journal of Applied Languages and Linguistics* (*J-ALL*) invites the submission of papers to appear on the journal’s special issue:

“Applied Linguistics and Task-Based Grammar”.

Aims and Scope:

Task-based language teaching (TBLT), also known as task-based instruction (TBI), focuses on the use of authentic language and on asking students to do meaningful tasks using the target language. In task-based approaches, the focus of classroom activities is on the task, and ultimately on meaning (for more on task-based teaching and learning). TBLT is a communicative approach in which students try to complete the task given by using the language instead of trying to use rules explicitly. TBLT is a bridge between classroom and daily life environment out of the classroom with the assistance of its communicative activities, which requires the interaction between students to perform a task in the classroom.

- Manuscripts submitted must follow APA Style (see the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, 6th edition, <http://www.apastyle.org/manual/>).
- When reporting research using quantitative and statistical methods, please provide measures of effect sizes, at least for the major statistical contrasts which you report.
- Published papers in the Journal of Applied Languages and Linguistics are usually between 2,000 and 4,000 words. All manuscripts must be accompanied by an abstract of up to 150 words. The Journal of Applied Languages and Linguistics will not consider articles that have been published or are being considered for publication elsewhere. Please ensure that your submission is substantially different from your other published or under-review work.
- Please submit a cover letter to the editor with your manuscript submission. In your letter, you must inform us of any potential ethical considerations, including conflicts of interest or overlap of the present submission with text or data appearing elsewhere in related published or under-review work.
